


BROADLAND DISTRICT COUNCIL SITE ALLOCATIONS

The Parish Council responds

The opportunity of giving residents an additional way of responding to the recent Broadland District Council Site Allocations Consultation saw 289 people register a visit to the new Council Office – Diamond Jubilee Lodge.

From those that visited 151 response packs were completed with each pack offering attendees the opportunity to comment on sites which have been proposed as preferred option sites for development in the parish.

At an additional Parish Council meeting held on 21 August 2013, the Parish Council considered it's response to the consultation which in addition to questions asked in respect of sites for development, asked for agreement or otherwise in respect of the settlement limit – this is to define an area within which development will generally be accepted and also of removal of an existing allocation from the plan as the site originally earmarked has not moved forward for development.

THE RESPONSE IN BRIEF

The settlement limit – this was not agreed as proposed and a request has been made to adjust this limit slightly in respect of an identified concern on the Low Road. Removal of the existing allocation – the site known as HEL1 in the Local Plan 2006 was shown as a housing allocation and the proposal is now to remove this site however the potential to develop would remain as the site remains within the settlement limit. The Parish Council did not agree to the removal of this allocated site.

The new sites allocated for development within the consultation are

- Land at Hellesdon Hospital Grounds

- Land at the Royal Norwich Golf Club
- Land adjacent to the existing Burial Ground and

- Land North East of Reepham Road - this land is commonly known as HEL2.

The latter two were accepted by the Council – this is in support of such land being proposed by the Council as a need in recognition of the nearing capacity of the current burial ground



and the lack of recreational open space of which the parish is deficient. The Hospital Ground allocation was disagreed to as proposed but the allocation for development with conditions was accepted. The Golf Club allocation did not receive agreement and as such the proposal to allocate this site was disagreed with.

The Parish Council wish to thank those who took the opportunity to visit the office during the week of 5th to 10th August and to advise those that completed a response pack that these have now been deposited with Broadland District Council.

These responses together with the Parish Council decision made 21st August will be considered by Broadland District Council which will ultimately make a decision on each proposal. The consultation process closed on 2nd September 2013.

PLANNING MATTERS



Since my last article for the Grapevine in August 2012, the Parish Council Planning Committee has dealt with over 100 planning applications. A significant number of these

are for the alteration and/or extension of existing dwellings or the creation of new ones. In each case, the members of the Committee give careful consideration to the submitted plans and the views of any local residents present at the meeting. The Planning Authority (Broadland District Council) is subsequently advised of these views. The Committee also advise local residents that they should always put their concerns or otherwise, to any application in writing to the District Council.

In addition to planning matters, we consider applications for the granting of licences for the sale of alcohol and other licensing requirements. Again the Committee gives careful consideration to the effect on any residential properties in the immediate area. When the District Council does not agree with our representations, an inquiry is held. This happened recently when MacDonald's on the Ring Road applied for a 24 hour a day use of the site and the Parish Council expressed

concern that this would have a significant impact on local residents. At the end of the inquiry, the District Council found in favour of MacDonald's but required signs to be erected on the site to discourage antisocial behaviour and half hourly checks of the car park to be made by the management. Although the Parish Council did not fully achieve it's aims, I believe the involvement of the Parish Council contributed to the imposition of safeguards on the permission. Unfortunately, our case was somewhat weakened as the 8 residents who were at our meeting and voiced their concerns, did not write to the District Council or attend the inquiry. We do need your support.

The public are invited to attend Planning Committee meetings. They generally take place on the first and third Tuesday of each month and the dates can be confirmed with the Parish Council office on 01603 301751. Should you wish to see details of any planning applications, they can be viewed on the Broadland District Council website www.broadland.gov.uk. RECREATION GROUND, MEADOW WAY & MOUNTFIELD PARK

where Parish Council staff have been subject to abuse while undertaking unlocking and locking duties.

The opening times of the areas adhere to staff employment times and have to be considered within other required duties. To remind and clarify the gates at the Recreation Ground are opened by the Caretakers who are employed Monday to Saturday from 7.30am and Sundays from 8am. Upon entering the site the duty, providing there are no apparent unusual circumstances, is to open the vehicular access on Woodview Road. The remaining site gates are opened after the requirement to enter Hellesdon Community Centre.

On Sundays in order to accommodate requirements, the opening of the Community Centre takes precedence of opening Woodview Road and the remaining site gates. Any unusual circumstances could result in action being taken that would delay or prevent unlocking of the site and this would be the case until any such circumstance is resolved.

With the number of external gates at the Recreation Ground needed to be opened, it takes 20 – 30 minutes to complete unlocking therefore providing there are no unusual circumstances, the area should be fully opened by approximately 8am and 8.30am respectively.

REPLACMENT PLAQUES IN THE MEMORIAL GARDEN

As advised in the Summer issue of The Grapevine, the plaques in the Memorial Garden within the bowling green area have now been replaced. Following lengthy investigation the Parish Council sourced the best material for the plaques and the new ones are of a weathproof and sturdy material which will last for a number of years.

The Parish Council is confident with the replacement plaques and so promotion of this area is to be considered by the Playing Fields, Amenities and Allotments Committee at its next committee meeting scheduled for 22nd October 2013 and details will be published in the Winter edition of The Grapevine.

The Parish Council now wish to invite those residents who wish to retrieve the metal memorial plaques to call or visit the Council Office so the necessary arrangements can be made.

AN UPDATE FROM COUNCILLOR SHELAGH GURNEY NORFOLK COUNTY COUNCILLOR &

CHAIRMAN, HELLESDON PARISH COUNCIL

The summer is always a busy time for Norfolk County Council Highways Maintenance Department, and as you will have no doubt noticed, Hellesdon is getting its fair share of repair work!

The mini roundabout and road ways at the Reepham Road Junction with Drayton Wood Road were recently repaired, with the roundabout being re-raised and white linage replaced. Repairs to the mini roundabouts on Middletons Lane are timetabled for future attention.

Contractors are currently very busy in the Cottinghams Drive vicinity, relaying and repairing some of the pavement surfaces. At the request of many residents using these pathways, I am delighted to announce that many road corners will now have kerbstones dropped to allow easier access for disability scooters and pushchairs. I would like to thank all those who supported me with this campaign. The Drayton High Road Pedestrian crossing lights, opposite Hellesdon Hospital, are scheduled to be replaced. The original equipment was first installed in 1977. The technology is prone to faults and has become increasingly difficult to repair. Costs for this have been accommodated within the allocated 2013/14 budget for traffic signals replacement.

The new Parish Council Office is now open, and the enhanced Disability Compliant facilities and equipment are in use. The Norfolk County Council Community Foundation scheme awarded a grant of £30,000 towards this project specifically for this purpose.

Norfolk County Council has recently awarded funding for some Speed Activated Monitoring signage, which are to be placed at speeding hot spots!

Finally, I hope you have all noticed the new "give way" sign at the junction with Raymond Road and Bush Road. Many residents requested the installation of this sign and it was sited very recently.

HELICOPTER MOVEMENTS

As Chairman of the Parish Council I have received a number of telephone calls with regard to helicopter movements in and out of Norwich Airport. I invited those callers to the Parish Council meeting on 6 August 2013, however only 3 residents attended to voice concerns they had relating to helicopter movements at Norwich Airport. The Council would appreciate YOUR VIEWS regarding this matter and following the recent successful Development in Hellesdon Consultation held in the Diamond Jubilee Lodge, a similar consultation exercise in respect of Helicopter Movements is scheduled for the week of 7th to 12th October. Once again the consultation will be held in the Council Chamber in Diamond Jubilee Lodge, during the Council Office opening times and will give residents the opportunity to complete a questionnaire for later consideration by the Parish Council.

Details will also be included on the Parish Council website and residents can still send comments they may have to the Council Office, either via email or in writing.

BUS SHELTERS IN HELLESDON

New Bus Shelters and Hardstandings

In the Summer edition of The Grapevine we advised that new shelters would be installed at Bush Road and Woodland Road and a seat for the shelter at the top of Reepham Road. These are now on order and it is anticipated installation will be completed by the next issue of The Grapevine. Unfortunately there has been a delay with installation as Norfolk County Council Highways have agreed to add a tarmac standing area and a hatched area on the road at Bush Road prior to this installation work. The work at all the above locations is anticipated to take place at the same time, which will reduce overall costs. The bus stop hatched area will be done to address concerns over parking issues in that area. Norfolk County Council Highways have also now confirmed the installation of a tarmac hardstanding at the bus stop on Reepham Road, adjacent to Cottinghams Drive, to replace the current grass verge and in the light of this the Parish Council have agreed to the installation of a bus shelter at this stop.

Insurance matters are nearing completion and a new shelter is on order. It is anticipated work to install will coincide with other shelter installations detailed above.





ANNUAL CARNIVAL 2013

However in hindsight, the drizzle helped to cool the air whilst preparations got underway for the 'big day' and the working group and council staff prepared the Recreation Ground to get the 'show on the road'

This is now a regular fixture and once again this year's event was held in aid of the Dogs Trust at Snetterton and the funds raised were presented to the Trust on 8 August 2013 – more information on this presentation can be found on the back page.

Another very successful Art and Crafts Exhibition was held in the Community Centre, displaying various paintings, drawings and crafts by local residents. The exhibition was organised by Mrs Freda Lane. As is customary practice a Thank You Service was held on Sunday 21st July in Hellesdon Community Centre conducted by Reverend Enid Jones-Blackett.

A host of thank you's. Without the hardwork, help and assistance of many, many people the Carnival would simply not happen. 



POLICING UPDATE

There's been an increase in the number of walk in/reach through type thefts across the Broadland area. The offences tend to be committed by the opportunist thief and although the warm weather spell encourages us to open all the windows, leave the doors open and spend time in the garden, we should be mindful of home security. Just small steps can prevent these intrusive incidents; if you are in the garden make sure the front of the house is secure by closing windows and locking access doors. If you leave your home for any length of time make sure all windows and doors are secure. An insecure window illustrates an open invitation to an opportunist thief to help themselves at your expense.

With the harvesting season well on the way, the bales and haystacks become easy target for mindless vandalism and fire-starting. Farmers are encouraged to leave firebreaks between stacks to prevent mass spreading and the community are asked to be vigilant for signs of fire in these vulnerable locations. Motorists and passer-bys are asked to be mindful as to where and how they dispose of lighted cigarettes and matches as the hedgerows continue to be tinder dry.

Cycle thefts have been on the increase across the areas, in particular Broadland. Cyclists are asked to secure their cycles when left, even for the shortest periods and where possible secure them to a solid item.

On a positive note, a male arrested for a series of theft from motor vehicles in the Hellesdon area is currently serving 12 weeks imprisonment for his crimes.


