THE GRAPEVINE 3 WINTER 2013

#### PROVISION OF GRIT BINS

The Parish Council as is custom and practice during winter months, receives many requests for grit bins. Grit bins are purchased by the Parish Council and are then 'gifted' to County Highways who accept the responsibility for filling and refilling. Maintenance of the bin remains with the parish; however, approval from Norfolk County Council Highways has to be gained before the siting of any grit bin on the highway. There have been occasions when approval to fund a grit bin has been obtained, only to find the agreement from highways cannot be secured. The Parish Council will not therefore fund or purchase any grit bin until highways approval is secured.

Highways have criteria when considering the siting of grit bins as follows:

- Would it mainly be for road or footway use? Use on a footway is only agreed in exceptional circumstances: e.g. outside a shopping centre or entrance to school on a sloping gradient or on an incline
- Proximity of gradients
- Proximity to bends in road
- Proximity to footbridges
- Proximity to existing bins
- Number of premises served
- Community facilities within 200m of site
- Winter priority routes within vicinity of site.

Not all the above criteria needs to be met, however some of the above points would work against the siting of a bin (e.g. if a Priority 1 or 2 gritting route goes along the road)

The Parish Council policy in respect of addressing requests is as follows:

- Any request for a grit bin is first presented to Highways to ascertain if approval would be granted.
- A negative response would be relayed to the requester and subsequently would be made known to the Parish Council. The Parish Council would have the opportunity to challenge the Highways decision.
- A positive response would be relayed to the requester, with the request presented to the Parish Council for consideration of purchase.

# PLAYINGFIELDS, AMENITIES & ALLOTMENTS COMMITTEE

A rewarding busy year! It is pleasing to see the completion this year of the refurbishment of the skate park and adjoining area. The work to separate the existing skate park area into 2 to provide the ever popular skateboarding facility and also a ball games area complete with a ball wall was somewhat delayed due to the requirements



of needing certain weather conditions to be suitable for the materials used. Work was finally completed at the beginning of the summer and an originally planned opening ceremony did not come to fruition as it was considered preferable to allow the anxious children who had been involved at the early stages of the design and who had waited so patiently for the area to be completed immediate access. It was a delight to see the area full and in use. This certainly was two very much welcome facilities.



The conservation area – the Diamond Jubilee Garden was also completed this year with the final work of the installation of 2

interpretation boards. You will recall the area was suggested by Kevin Sage the Councils Head Groundsman and following a bid for grant aid to the Big Lottery Fund which was successful the rejuvenation of this tired area has developed into a haven for wildlife and wildflowers. The area is now part of the routine maintenance budget of the council and it is hoped more flora can be added in future years.

Unfortunately this year we have lost the use of several items in the older childrens' play area on the Recreation

Ground through premature failure. It is even more frustrating that the supplier has gone out of business leaving the council with a prospective bill for suitable replacements which now need to be budgeted for. The removal of the youth shelter, commonly known as 'the pod' which was moved to allow for the new parish council office build is in store. It was intended to have this re-sited on completion of the build however the Councils Property Policy & Resources Committee is discussing refurbishment and possibly



reconfiguration of the car park at the community centre site and it has been decided to await finalisation of this before reinstalling the pod.

Meadow Way has benefited this year from installation of new play equipment and additional seating is on order and more trees and shrubs will be planted as weather permits to further enhance use of the area. At the time of writing we are coming to the end of the trial opening of Mountfield Park and discussions will now commence as to the future. The opening of the area has been popular and mainly problem free. It is hoped by the time of the Spring 2014 Grapevine, matters will have been dealt and a full update can be given. In the meantime any information in respect of this area would be published on our website <a href="https://www.hellesdon-pc.gov.uk">www.hellesdon-pc.gov.uk</a>.

Lastly we finish the year with exciting news which is the signing of a document which secures the lease on land on the northern fringe of the parish at the top of Reepham Road. It goes without saying that developing the area will make next year even busier and just as rewarding!

# SITE ALLOCATIONS A FURTHER CONSULTATION EXERCISE

In the Autumn 2013 edition of The Grapevine the Parish Council advised on the consultation exercise held at the Parish Council offices in August and of its decision to the proposals for preferred option sites for development. Since then further sites within the Parish have been put forward for development by the land owner which are described as land east and west of Reepham Road. The Parish Council held a further additional consultation on these two sites in


November and forwarded any completed response packs to

Broadland District Council for consideration.

#### The Parish Council decision -

The Parish Council objected to both additional proposals citing increases in traffic and pressure on local schools and health facilities as the major concerns. In addition the site described as land east of Reepham Road, known locally as HEL2, was in the first round of consultation proposed as formal recreational space.

It is still the Parish Council's desire to acquire more land to add to the leased area recently acquired. As the parish is desperately short of recreational land it is hoped that Broadland District Council will opt for the preferred option outlined in the summer.



#### What happens now?

Broadland District Council will consider the various options and hope to issue a pre submission draft of the preferred sites allocations in spring 2014. The plan will then undergo an independent examination in public which will be conducted by the Planning Inspectorate to test for soundness.

There will be an opportunity to comment on the proposals again at this stage. This examination is scheduled to take place late summer/early autumn 2014. Assuming the plan passes this stage Broadland District Council will look to formally adopt the plan by early 2015. We will of course keep you updated via The Grapevine and our website.

The Parish Council wish thank those who took the opportunity to visit the office during the week of 18<sup>th</sup> - 23<sup>rd</sup> November. The consultation process closed 25<sup>th</sup> November.

#### BUS SHELTERS IN HELLESDON

New bus shelters with seating have now been installed at Bush Road and Woodland Road, together with the addition of a seat for the shelter opposite Hellesdon Medical Practice at the top Reepham Road.

## MELLESDON PARISH COUNCIL MANAGEMENT OF OUTDOOR SURFACES IN SEVERE WEATHER CONDITIONS

Inder the terms of the Occupiers' Liability Acts 1957 and 1984 the Parish Council is responsible for taking all reasonably practicable measures to ensure the safety of all visitors to its premises and land. This includes the need for suitable precautions during severe weather conditions.

The areas covered by this policy are hard surface car parks and hard surface footways to the main entrances of buildings, and the policy has been developed following a review of the existing risk assessment.

In order to comply with the legal requirement in a practical manner, the Parish Council's policy with regard to the management of surfaces which may become hazardous due to snow and ice is as follows:

- We will ensure that areas are well-lit during times of poor visibility when the sites are open, so that obstructions and potential hazards can be seen.
- We will inspect hard surface car parks and access ways to buildings daily during severe
  weather conditions. We will endeavour to clear snow and ice and spread salt/grit on the
  cleared area to provide a designated pathway to buildings. We may take other action
  deemed appropriate and this may be displaying suitable notices closing car parks or
  other measures that may be considered practicable.
- We **will not** grit/salt the remainder of the parking areas or non-essential access routes.
- We will keep a log of inspections carried out and any action taken.

### Control of Dogs

Residents will be aware from articles in The Grapevine of the Parish Council's campaign to encourage dog owners to adhere to the Council's agreed requests to be responsible and:

\* Keep dogs under control and on a lead

\* Keep dogs out of play areas

\* Keep dogs to the perimeter of the Recreation Ground and Meadow Way due to the nature of children, footballers and others who play in those areas.

# DOG WALKERS

- The Parish Council requests dog owners to be responsible: - Keep your dog under control and on a lead
- Keep your dog out of play areas
- Keep your dog to the perimeter of the field due to the nature
- of children, footballers and others who play in those areas. - Use the dog waste bins (RED) that are provided NOT litter bins (GREEN)

The Parish Council has discussed and considered pursuing Dog Control Orders and have resolved to take no action in this respect at the moment. The Parish Council continue to try to take a pragmatic view. those who want to exercise their dogs, those who dislike or fear dogs, the needs of children, both accompanied younger children, and their older siblings enjoying increasing independence out of immediate parental supervision. There are those who want to participate in organised team sports and those merely seeking to have a quiet stroll on a pleasant day. Given that Hellesdon remains short of public open space there inevitably have to be compromises.

Our Spring 2012 Grapevine gave the opportunity for users of the Recreation Ground to complete a survey and to indicate usage of the area. responses were mixed and no pattern or concensus could be gained, comments in respect of dogs produced the diversity of views that might be Some wished to ban them altogether, others saw no problem whatsoever in allowing dogs off leads. There was concern about levels of dog mess from both parents and those participating in sports regarding dangers to children and vulnerability of both humans and smaller dogs from uncontrolled dogs.

Against these competing views it is inevitable that not everyone will be satisfied by the Council decision that dogs will continue to be allowed on both the Recreation Ground and Meadow Way - but please, on a lead and around the periphery of the fields only. There is no vendetta against dog owners - councillors are dog owners too!

Please have regard to the rules for Dog Walkers and clear up after your dog. Failure to do so will put increasing pressure on the Council potentially to the point where it may be considered necessary to ban dogs altogether, undertake Dog Control Orders with significant cost to the Council.

If you want to exercise your dog off a lead this is currently allowed on Mountfield Park which was opened by Broadland District Council earlier this year.

#### HELLESDON MEMORIAL GARDEN

The last edition of The Grapevine advised that the plaques in the Memorial Garden had been replaced. The Playing Fields Amenities and Allotments committee considered this area at it's meeting on  $22^{nd}$  October. It was agreed to extend the Memorial Garden across to the right hand side of the Bowling




The Trustees and Staff of Hellesdon Community Centre would like to wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

#### POLICING UPDATE

There has been some good news in relation to burglaries. Due to a sharp eyed member of the public who disturbed someone breaking into a house, we have arrested and charged one person with burglary in North Norfolk. This is an excellent result and the investigation is on-going. In relation to burglaries of buildings other than houses, someone has admitted a large number of offences across North Norfolk and Broadland to police. This is likely to have a good impact on the number of offences being committed

Having said that we are still experiencing some house burglaries of detached rural homes, items stolen include jewellery, camera equipment, laptop computers and cash. Entry is usually at the back and the times of offences are daytime and

evening when occupants are clearly away from the property. Please be vigilant to observe people acting suspiciously or who look out of place and if you go out try to make your house appear occupied and ensure maximum security. We are also having reports of tools stolen from vehicles, sheds and commercial premises, so if you have expensive tools please don't put them on show and secure them as best you can. Please continue to be vigilant and keep valuables out of sight. Please call the police on the 101 non emergency number if you see anything suspicious or on 999 if an offence is in progress, or Crimestoppers if you have information about offences or offenders.


#### COMMUNITY SPEEDWATCH, HOME WATCH VOLUNTEER APPEAL

**Community Speed Watch** was launched in 2007 and is a project working across Norfolk empowering communities to play an active part alongside the police and the Safety Camera Partnership in tackling the problem of speeding in their neighbourhoods.

In an effort to help tackle the common complaint of speeding, teams of volunteers, (minimum of 6) who have their parish council support, have been trained to use speed guns across the County. One of the volunteers acts as the coordinator and is the point of contact for the team and responsible for looking after the radar equipment.

The groups are issued with a speed radar gun, 2 community Speed Watch signs and reflective jackets. Volunteers then carry out speed checks in 30 and 40 mph limits working to Norfolk Constabulary's guidelines.

Returns are completed logging various details such as vehicle registration mark, make, model or colour. These are then sent into the Safety Camera Partnership team, who obtain the registered keeper details. Registered keepers whose vehicles are observed breaking the speed limit will have their details recorded and will receive a warning letter requesting them to keep their speed down.



Those who persistently offend will be notified to Roads Policing and the local Safer Neighbourhood Team for police enforcement action.

Norfolk currently has 48 Teams with new teams awaiting training.

Norfolk Home Watch Association in partnership with Norfolk Constabulary has prepared this introductory guide for people who are considering setting up a new scheme where they live and wish to find out a little more about Home Watch.

The guide sets out the objectives of Home Watch, it briefly explains what membership involves, whilst outlining the role of the Coordinator and explains what to do next if you want to start a scheme in your neighbourhood.





All councils need to produce an annual revenue budget which sets out the financial requirements for the forthcoming year. This becomes the basis upon which spending policy is approved and how the amount of cash required in order to finance the spending plan is calculated.

The annual budget preparation is of a schedule of all the headings under which the council is committed to spend or likely to receive cash.

Income is obtained from a number of sources such as sports facilities hire, allotment rent, advertising in The Grapevine, carnival plot hire, grants and income on investments.

Expenditure needs to include the cost of maintaining various amenity and play areas at the Recreation Ground and Meadow Way, as well as the Memorial Garden at the Recreation Ground, together with the allotments at Bush Road

The difference of the sum of money between income and expenditure is raised by the way of a precept. A Parish Council has the power to precept (tax) their residents to support its operations and to carry out local projects.

The above charts show where the money has come from and how it was spent for the financial year ended March 2013.

As is evident from the diagrams employment of staff impacts extremely high on council expenditure, with the high proportion needed for salaries and associated costs for our caretakers. The caretakers and a Housekeeper are employed by the Parish Council to serve in the Community Centre which is managed by a group of volunteers known as Hellesdon Community Centre Executive Committee and is registered as a charity.

The accounts for the financial year 2012/13 have now been approved by the appointed Auditors and a copy of the documentation can be viewed on our website under the heading of Council – sub section Annual Return.
