PARISH COUNCIL TO TAKE OVER OWNERSHIP AND RESPONSIBILITY FOR MOUNTFIELD PARK

he Parish Council agreed at its monthly meeting in January to take over responsibility for Mountfield Park. The Park, currently owned by Broadland District Council, will be transferred into the name of the Parish Council; a process which could take up to nine months to complete. "We are still in a partnership arrangement at present with the District Council" explained Parish Council Chairman Cllr. Shelagh Gurney, "however once the transfer has been completed the Parish Council will be solely responsible for the maintenance and development of the area." The Parish Council is aware that the park has been well utilised by residents since its opening and many have enjoyed the open space. The Park was opened in May 2013 for a trial period to gauge opinion and to monitor usage. Cllr Gurney added "The trial period has been successful and we are glad so many Hellesdon residents have enjoyed the facility. We are grateful to our colleagues at Broadland District Council who have worked with us to ensure a successful outcome". The Park, situated off Mountfield Avenue, is open daily from 8.00am.

UPDATE ON AMENITY LAND

he formalities concerning the amenity land at the top of Reepham Road has now been completed and the Parish Council has taken over control of the land. Work will begin shortly to erect fencing in line with the agreements set out by the landowner in the lease. The permissive footpath along the edge of the area will remain in place. Hello. I'm the Oracle and invite residents to ask questions on what to do and who to contact when assistance is needed on local matters.

I work for several organisations supporting local community projects which are in need of funds. Are there grants or funding available to assist?



Broadland District Council has a Small Grant Scheme which aims to fund projects that bring benefits to community life. This can include projects such as:

Supporting older people, Supporting young people, Supporting 'community champions', Supporting the environment

Broadland District Council has up to £500 available for projects costing no more than £5,000 in total (although it does not usually fund 100% of project costs). The Small Grant Scheme is available all year round, subject to funds being available and there is an application form to complete and eligibility criteria to fulfil. Broadland District Council can also offer grants of up to £500 from the Community Small Grants Programme to support community-led activities relating to the commemorative period for World War I. ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

Every English Parish must have a Parish Meeting. This meeting consists of the local government electors registered for the area for which it is held – this means all those who have a right to vote in Hellesdon. The meeting must be held each year between 1^{st} March and 1^{st} June inclusive and must not commence before 6pm. This is not a Council Meeting but a meeting of registered electors.

Historically Hellesdon's Annual Meeting has been organised by Hellesdon Parish Council and is usually held in April and the Chairman of Hellesdon Parish Council presides at this meeting. This is one of the final duties of the Civic year. A guest speaker from Norfolk County Council Highways, Head of the Aylsham Depot has been invited to attend.

This year the Annual Parish Meeting will be held on Wednesday 16th April in the Sylvia Watling Room of Hellesdon Community Centre and will commence at 7pm.

The meeting is an opportunity for the Parish Council to explain to its residents its activities over the last year. However the purpose of the meeting is to enable the electors to discuss parish affairs and to pass resolutions in respect of what is felt to be important to them. Therefore if you have any issues you wish to discuss for example:

- Recreational space including allotment provision
- Play Equipment
- Dog fouling

- Planning queries future development in Hellesdon
- Highway matters such as pot holes
- Helicopter noise

.....or the like then this is your opportunity to voice your concerns.

We have a policy that no more than 25% of The Grapevine will be paid advertisements.

News from Heather Avenue Infant School.



School may only have started on the 7th January but it has been a busy two weeks at Heather Avenue Infant School. The first week back saw all the children arrive ready and eager to learn and they spent the week finding out about Russia. The second week back continued to be a busy one as it was Events Week at Heather Avenue. Events Week sees all the children in school divided into mixed aged groups and allows them to spend time in every class in school focussing on different themes each day.

On Monday the children enjoyed a Numeracy Day which saw the children complete number, shape and measuring activities, as well as handling data and solving problems.

On Tuesday it was Science Day. The children identified trees found in our school, investigated forces, explored magnets, found out about ice and learnt about the seasons and lifecycles. Wednesday saw our school focus on Eco activities, we planted butterfly friendly plants, learnt about bees, investigated why trees are important, found out about recycling and designed our own Eco Hero.

Thursday was our Literacy Day the children completed activities based on the story The Nutcracker. This included creating storyboards, writing letters and postcards and character portraits.

The week was finished off with an Arts Day where all our work was based on the painting Morston by local artist Fiona Roberts. Each child created their own individual art pieces using a variety of medium and classes created whole class art work. This work will be displayed to the public later during the year when the school takes part in "Open Studios".

Poppy Appeal 2014

Once again, we had a great response from all our nimble fingered supporters, and managed to amass over 900 poppies. We were impressed by all the various different individual touches on the poppies, and it was lovely to be able to distribute a variety of designs to various locations in the community, as we did last year.

We were hoping to beat last years total of £362.15 raised for the Royal British Legion's Poppy Appeal. In fact, we were able to raise an amazing £1181.04, which Royal British Legion collected on 10th December, pictured left.

As you can imagine, we are absolutely thrilled with this, and will definitely be doing this again next year. Having poppies knitted throughout the year and building up a good stock of poppies really helped, so if anyone would like to continue knitting poppies for us for the Royal British Legion 2014 campaign that will be wonderful.

We are still asking for 6" (15cm) squares in garter stitch (plain knit) which are being sewn into blankets for local nursing homes. We have been able to give over 40 blankets away over the course of the year, so if anyone is fed up with poppies, we would be glad to receive their squares! We also have a build up of squares which need to be sewn together, so if anyone would like to sew these for us, or know of anyone who would like to do this, please let us know as above.

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

What is "Community Speed Watch"?

Community Speed Watch (*CSW*) schemes arose from an idea to involve local residents in speed reduction activity in the village of Ash, Somerset. After a successful pilot in the eastern area of Norfolk, the scheme is now being rolled out county wide. Put simply, speed monitoring is carried out by trained volunteers from the community, with follow-up work on education and enforcement by Norfolk Police and your Local Authority.







Safer Neighbourhood Action Panel (SNAP)

The Hellesdon, Horsford & Horsham St Faiths Safer Neighbourhood Action Panel (SNAP) met on 13 January 2014. At this meeting the panel's priorities were discussed. The following is an update on the reviewed and new priorities of the Panel:

Review of adopted priorities:-

To support the evolution of Community Speed Watch and tackle speeding across the parishes. It was agreed that speeding will remain a live priority for the next three months.

To assist in a multi agency approach to parking issues in Manor Road associated with the Crematorium. Councillor Gurney said that this objective has been achieved and will be removed from the list of priorities.

To investigate the possibility of a Kinsale drop off point Councillor Gurney said this priority had been thoroughly examined and due to Highways placing it onto their 2014/15 list of expenditure, will be removed from the current list of priorities.

New Priority Plans:-

- To continue to support Community Speed Watch (CSW) and tackle speeding across the parishes.
- To continue to monitor parking problems at the junction of Heath Crescent and Fifers Lane.

Date of the next meeting: At 7pm on Wednesday 23rd April 2014 at Parish Council Office, Diamond Jubilee Lodge, Hellesdon Community Centre site, Middletons Lane, Hellesdon, NR6 5SR.

SNAP UPDATE

During the recent priority setting meeting for the area it was reported that over the last three months 15 hours of checks had been carried out by volunteers with seven motorists found speeding in excess of 38mph. The team is short of members and keen to recruit more volunteers.

Speeding in the neighbourhood remains a priority for the local safer neighbourhood team who have carried out speed checks and worked with the district council to use the 'Smiley Sid' speed monitoring systems.



Monitors were used in Manor Road, Horsham St Faiths, Middletons Lane and Reepham Road, Hellesdon taking details of about 1,400 vehicles, with the average speed being 28mph. The highest recorded was 44mph.

Over a three month period 105 drivers have been issued with verbal warnings with 32 accepting a speed awareness course. Twenty one fixed penalty notices were

issued while two motorists were reported for summons for excessive speeding in Manor Road, Horsham St Faiths.

Meanwhile, officers updated panel members of work to resolve parking issues in Manor Road, associated with the Crematorium.

It was revealed that funding has been obtained to purchase a number of wooden posts in order to prevent vehicles obstructing the footpath outside the Crematorium.

Finally, police carried out several patrols in Kinsale Avenue, Hellesdon in response to concerns about obstructive parking and work continues to explore creating a school drop-off point.

The panel agreed to continue the with speeding as a priority and also monitoring parking problems at the junction of Fifers Lane and Heath Crescent.
